Year 7 Catch Up 2017-2018

Each Year Turves Green Boys' School receives additional funding made available by the DfE to support those students who do not reach a level 4 in Reading and/or Mathematics at the end of Key Stage 2.

In 2016-17, 10% of Year 7 students at Turves Green Boys' School were eligible for Catch Up funding.

The Year 7 Catch Up Grant for Turves Green Boys' School for the financial year 2016/2017 was £18,505.

Proposed spending in 2017-18

In 2017-18, 20% of Year 7 students are eligible for Catch Up funding. A total of £18,505 Year 7 Catch Up funding will be allocated into the schools' budget and proposed expenditure will be in the following areas;

- Development and delivery of an alternate curriculum for students with low prior attainment in English (Vector)
- Further development of 8-week intensive intervention programme aimed at accelerating progress of students with low prior attainment in Maths
- External support from Educational Psychologist
- RADY+ Programme
- New Start Programme (MHWB)
- Maintain staffing levels to support eligible students
